

## Background Stained Glass Tutorial

*Use a very detailed background stamp to create this pretty background that looks like delicate stained glass. Filmed by Beth Norman.*

### Finished Card:

Artist: Beth Norman

Stamps: Impression Obsession; Hampton Art Stamps



### Supplies:

- Detailed Background Stamp
- Ink
- White Cardstock (same size as black cardstock)
- Black Cardstock (same size as white cardstock)
- Paper Cutter
- Coloring Medium (Markers, Colored Pencils, etc.)
- Adhesive
- Ruler
- Pencil



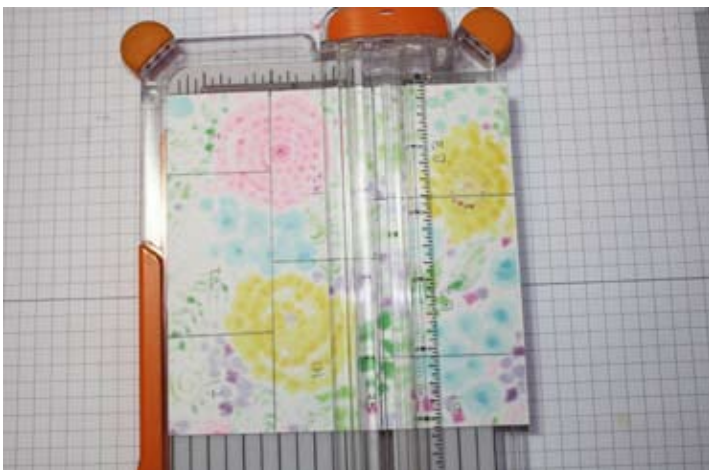
### Step One:

Ink the background and stamp on white cardstock.



### Step Three:

Trim the colored cardstock down  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (for  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " cards) to  $\frac{3}{4}$ " (for 6" x 6" cards) on top and side of cardstock. This allows for space in between the cut pieces.



### Step Five:

Cut along the pencil lines. Keep the pieces in order.



### Step Two:

Color the image with the coloring medium.



### Step Four:

Use the pencil and ruler on the back of the stamped image to draw two horizontal lines, evenly spaced from the top and bottom. Draw two vertical lines on the top section, one in the middle section, and two on the bottom section.



### Step Six:

Adhere the pieces, in order, to the black cardstock. Leave even spaces between the lines.



### Step Seven:

Continue adhering stained glass pieces. Finish card as desired or leave it with just the stained glass showing.

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
