Supplies:


- Corrugated Cardboard, cut to size of project
- Die Cut for Window
- Die Cut Machine (not shown)
- Pencil
- Coloring Medium of Choice
- Ink
- Cardstock for behind window
- Optional: Stamp Positioner (not shown)

Step One:

Determine the position of the die cut window and use the die cut and machine to cut the cardboard. The cardboard may need to be cut twice, depending on its thickness.




Step Three:

Remove the cardboard.



Step Five:

Place and adhere the colored image behind the window and finish as desired.



Step Two:

Cut the cardstock larger than the window but smaller than the die cut. Place behind the window and lightly trace with the pencil.




Step Four:

Stamp the image in the window area. Use a stamp positioner, if desired, for precise placement. Color image as desired. Erase pencil lines.
