Supplies:

- Patterned papers
- Neutral cardstock
- Embossing folder
- Embossing machine (not pictured)
- Scissors or paper cutter (not pictured)
- Adhesive spray adhesive, Xyron, or glue stick (not pictured)

Step One:

Cut patterned papers into 1 inch squares.



Step Three:

Place the 1 inch patterned paper squares onto adhesive-covered cardstock. Start by placing opposing corners on the edge of the cardstock so it looks like a diamond pattern.



Step Five:

With scissors or paper cutter, cut off the overhanging pieces of patterned paper from the cardstock.



Step Two:

Cover neutral cardstock with adhesive (Xyron used here).



Step Four:

Continue placing squares onto adhesive-covered cardstock until the cardstock is completely covered.



Step Six:

Emboss the paper-covered cardstock with an embossing folder and embossing machine. Use piece as desired.
