Pastel Embossing Tutorial

Chalks are such a great coloring tool. This method of using them produces an intense, dynamic look with the elegance of embossing. The images pop off the pages!



Supplies:

- Chalks/Pastels
- White Craft Ink Pad
- Clear Detail Embossing Powder
- Cotton Balls/Chalk Applicators
- Heat Tool
- Stamp Positioner
- Medium or Dark Cardstock
- Stamp Image with Bold Areas



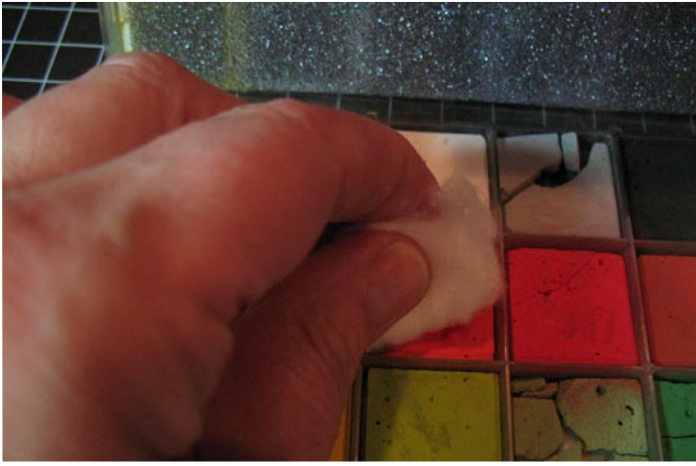
Step One:

Ink stamp with white craft ink and stamp on cardstock.



Step Two:

Stamp the image on the stamp positioner.



Step Three:

Apply chalk color to a cotton ball and dab onto the image in the areas desired. Repeat with other colors, completely coloring the image.



Step Three, Continued:



Step Four:

Use chalk to color around the outside of the image, on the cardstock, if desired.



Step Five:

Align the stamp positioner image over the chalk-colored image.



Step Six:

Reink the stamp with white ink and align in correct position to restamp over image.

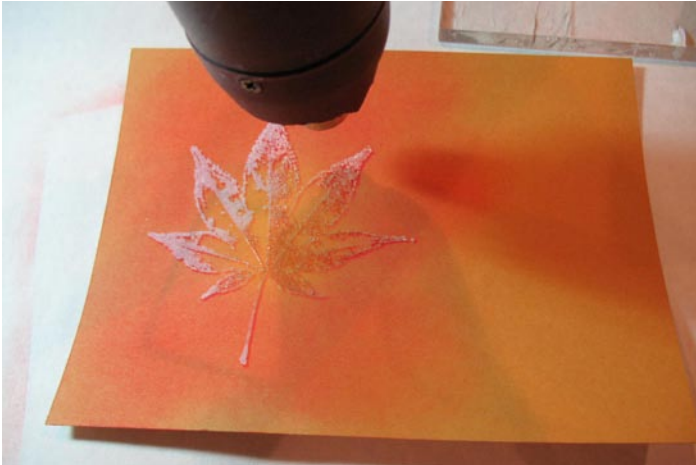


Step Six, Continued:



Step Seven

Cover the image with clear detail embossing powder and heat emboss. The colors will pop out as the powder melts.

Mat and embellish as desired.

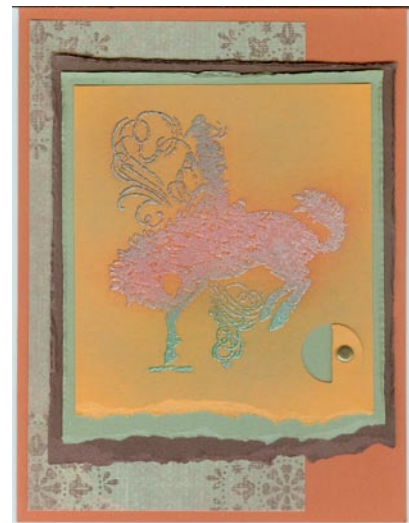
